GOLDFISH.....It's About Time

If you're reading this, then chances are you have a koi pond and, chances are you might find yourself sitting mesmerized by their fluid swimming and watching how they interact with their environment. If you have a koi pond then chances are when you were a child you had goldfish. and yes, chances are you also enjoyed sitting, watching them interact in their own little aquarium world. Often this is how a hobby begins as a childhood fascination.

When it comes time to build our first pond many of us immediately decided to have goldfish in our pond, after all we enjoyed watching them in our youth. Then came the discovery of koi, but to have koi we needed a bigger pond because koi "grow." Many goldfish such as Comets and Shubunkins can live quite nicely with koi, but once you enter into the fascinating and sometimes bizarre world of fancy goldfish then an aquarium or separate pond is required. We delight in the visual enjoyment our koi and goldfish bring us. As with hobbies we have a desire to learn more and acquire the best specimens we can afford and that hobby leads us to the point where we want to show off what lovely fish we have collected. We want to gather with others like us in friendly competition with our fish, therefore exhibiting in a koi show seems a natural progression. This provides us with the opportunity to have knowledgeable judges examine our fish and determine how good we are at choosing and raising fine specimens.

A koi breeder is an artist, he plans and breeds his koi in a wild kaleidoscope of colors and patterns to be living jewels in our pond. The body shape or canvas stays the same just the picture displayed on it may vary. With goldfish it is not the picture that changes so much but rather the canvas, Goldfish are living sculptures that have been molded into wild and unusual body shapes.

To add these living sculptures to your hobby of fish keeping only requires maintaining an aquarium or if you prefer, the addition of another smaller pond. Having an aquarium means you can enjoy watching your fish year round from a comfortable chair. As for me, I added a small 1,500 gallon pond as part of my patio with spitters and air stones providing circulation and aeration connected to a small filter system. Fancy goldfish are too trusting and slow to avoid predators therefore my small pond is covered. Even the smallest backyard can accommodate a goldfish pond. I also have an aquarium but I use it for quarantine.

Some beautiful imported goldfish are available on the Internet. With just the click of a mouse they can be shipped to your door. Show quality goldfish can be bought at very affordable prices. Importers with beautiful goldfish from whom I have bought are:

How Old Is This Koi?

Why is there never a simple answer to a question about koi? Japanese breeders use the name *tosai* to indicate koi that are less than a year old. The term has been adopted by koi keepers the world over, and is often confused or misused.

Most koi are spawned in May or June, and technically, the name *tosai* should only be used from the time they are harvested until the end of December. This means that "tosai" are available for purchase in the fall.

Once January rolls around, they become **ake nisai** or "early two year olds", and are no longer considered **tosai**.

When they are again harvested in the fall, having lived through two growing seasons, they are referred to as *nisai* or "two year olds".
