You may have seen it in action at the koi auction at Coastal this past April. It is now installed at home. IT is the WILIFE brand surveillance system – and it is fabulous. You buy an indoor camera “starter pack.” Sam’s sold me mine for about \$250. It has a camera – with mounting stuff, like a suction cup for windows – that you merely plug into a regular wall socket. Then you plug an adapter into your computer and any other wall socket or power strip. The system uses your regular 120v. power wiring as its antenna. It’s fully installed just by plugging it in. The quality is very good at 640x480.

What we are using it, and two additional cameras (+/- \$200 each from Amazon = one indoor and one outdoor out on the deck) for is to watch the backyard. Besides the fish, we have two cats in the backyard – and their food plates. The system automatically records when there is motion – right on the computer’s hard drive. So, come evening, I sit down in front of the TV and whip thru the day’s videos at 8X speed. If I find something I want to save – I press the button and save it. Or e-mail it. Poof! So, if I see a raccoon at the dinner plate – a hav-a-hart trap “magically” appears for their relocation. If I see a **\$%#@ heron**, I can watch and figure out why the 3 scarecrows (motion activated sprinklers = our first line of defense) didn’t work at scaring him off immediately and take proper action.



It is a fun way to see what is really going on while we are away. EXCEPT when we see the heron is back – like Monday the 21st! So, I now know what I am up against, again, and can plan my defenses better. Wednesday I sat in my office and watched my backyard on one of my monitors to see if he came back. Yup, right over the internet. Easy as pie. AND, if you want, it can even e-mail you when there is motion – with or without picture or video. Oh, and it also works very well as a security system... An Old...New Pond Build

There are many ways to design and build a out of doors koi pond. One of the design choices is the elevation of the pond surface. Two approaches come to mind, ground level or semi-raised. By ground level we mean a pond that has walls that approximately level with the surrounding ground. You will see this approach commonly used for most swimming pools, water gardens, and koi ponds. Semi-raised ponds are those that have walls that bring the wall elevation well above the surrounding ground level. It is also possible to a combination on sloping terrain that is close to ground level on the uphill side and is elevated on the downhill side.

Let me make a suggestion, next time you plan a new pond, or update of an existing pond consider a semi-raised design. If you raise the pond level 12-36” above grade, you can have the following benefits:

- Less chance of children and other pets getting into pond (please consider fencing pond area regardless of design)
- Deeper pond compared for the same digging effort (remember koi are riverine carp)
- Greater water volume for the same digging effort (larger ponds are generally more stable)
- Less chance of wind-blown debris in the pond (but there is still no substitute for having bottom drains and skimmers)
- Less chance of water entering pond from yard (water could contain pesticides and fertilizers)
- Less chance of losing fish from pond being flooded and fish swimming away
- The above ground pond walls provide a mounting location for electrical receptacles (be sure to use GFCI circuit breaker or receptacle)
- The walls give you and your guests great seating from which to watch the living jewels



Yes, a semi-raised pond will likely cost more than a ground level pond. There will be additional building materials and labor. In balance, I suggest it is one of the best investments you can make in the hobby. The older I get the more I appreciate being able to sit on the pond wall and feeding the fish some treats.
