



Did you know the AKC has a library? As a matter of fact the AKC has a new librarian, too, and along with that change has come about a few changes in the process of checking out material from our library.

- 1. The complete library inventory is available on the club website, <u>www.atlantakoiclub.org</u> under the tab Club Library.
- 2. The inventory lists the media type, title, author and deposit information if required.
- 3. To check library material out send the title of the requested item to books@atlantakoiclub.org with Library Request in the Subject line. This will avoid the request form ending up in the spam folder.
- 4. If available, the requested item will be delivered to the next club meeting. If the request can not be fulfilled you will receive an email notification.
- 5. You may check the material out until the following meeting. For longer check out periods just ask.
- 6. Deposits, if required, are accepted in form of a check made payable to AKC with the title in the memo area. The check will only be cashed if you fail to return the item. This saves you from having us camped out in your front yard until you return the material.

Any member in good standing may check out material from the library.

Greater Louisville Koi and Goldfish Society Show Update Vicki Knill

Every Memorial Day weekend is the date of the Greater Louisville Koi & Goldfish Society Show. This was our first visit and for those who have never attended please let me recommend you put this on your "To Do List" for next year.

The show is held on the beautifully manicured property of Charles and Caroline Phelps. We were told the Phelps have graciously hosted the show for the past 6 years. Three large tents provided cover for the koi show, vendors & goldfish show, and banquet area. A small permanent building was built with restrooms, concession and to provide a storage place for the club's show equipment.

Charles and Caroline allowed visitors to view their own pond and prize winning koi. Caroline's rose garden with it's award winning tea roses is a sight to behold. Next to the large roses is a garden of miniature roses which leads to the lily pond with it's small goldfish. The shaded gazebo allows one to take in the colorful sight of the yard.

Held annually at the same location the Louisville Koi & Goldfish show has become a regular event for the public. A full-page article with color pictures about a club member's pond was featured in the newspaper just before the show acted as a reminder to the public of the event. While show exhibitors, vendors and other koi club members were allowed to

park on the large expanse of lawn the general public were guided to park at a school just behind the property. Fencing and trees provided privacy from the school but a small gate was open allowing visitors access to the property.

Carl and I traveled in our RV and were able to park on site. From our vantage point we could observe the steady stream of visitors to the show. Vendors were happy to be kept busy with the crowd. At 3pm closing on Sunday the vendor tent was still full of visitors, while others walked past the show tanks, some of which by that time were empty.

For the **Atlanta Koi Club Friendship Award** we selected a Gin Rin B 20-24" Bekko owned by John Sprinkle. This female was of a beautiful size and shape. Her color was that of ice white which was even more enhanced by the sparkling

OLD BUSINESS

Creation of the club's new information pamphlets has been completed. Kathy Scales suggested we are now ready to have 1000 printed up. Suggestion was moved by David Marier and seconded by Ron Scott.

T-shirts for the Koi & Goldfish Show are completed. Vicki Knill asked if the club could pay the cost which would then be reimbursed when enough shirts have been sold. David Marier motioned to cover the costs, seconded by Jerry Hord.

NEW BUSINESS

The date for the release of the donated koi to the Carter Center as been postponed by the Carter Center. So far the possible date is June 4th, but this has yet to be confirmed.

Ron Scott is continuing to work toward filing for nonprofit status with the IRS. He has provided the statement of finances of the club for the past 5 years. The club must now provide a list of inventory assets. In order to file for nonprofit status the appropriate application must be submitted with a check for \$500.00. Vicki Knill moved to approve sending in the application and check, seconded by Jerry Hord.

The club will be selling some of the old 6 foot show tanks at the upcoming auction, new tanks like these sell for \$300.00. After discussion it was agreed the club would sell 10 6ft tanks for a cost of \$100.00 each. Other items from the trailer that are no longer needed by the club would also be sold at that time.

Ray Brock and Jay Drew are working to fill a volunteer list for the auction. Jay said volunteers are needed to set up the tanks at Coastal Ponds in Tucker after 6pm on Wed, Thurs, and Friday. Person available to assist can just show up during those evenings. Ray Brock has a volunteer list of duties needed to be filled during the auction and as always help in needed after the auction. Members willing to help can contact Ray or Jay.

The meeting concluded and the membership enjoyed the relaxing country atmosphere of Morris & Robin Smith's pond and yard complete with friendly donkeys and wonderful pottery created by Robin.
