

Dilution is the Solution to Pollution!

By pollution we mean anything added to the pond that is not wanted in the pond. Pollutants may come from outside the pond or from within the pond itself, i.e. oil leaking from a submerged pump. Some pollutants are easy to identify and control and/or remove, i.e. leaves, pollen, dead rats, etc.. Most of the harmful pollutants that dissolve into the water are hard to identify or quantify. Surface water runoff that can enter the pond is often a major source of pollutants. This is why all ponds should be designed with a raised edge or at least

some type of channel around them so that the surface water will not enter the pond. Other pollution is the byproducts of the biological processes going on in a pond of fish and plants. Yes, I said plants. No, I am specifically talking about water gardens. Most koi ponds have algae on the walls, and, perhaps in the water column. So again....fish **and** plants.

Some pollutants can be prevented...but many can not. So the real question is how to do with water pollution that constantly getting worse? For most ponds the only solution to pollution is dilution. By dilution we means <u>regular</u> water changes. Partial water changes can reduce the amount of anything dissolved in the water but not totally remove it. A water change out is considered to be when a measured amount of water is drained from the pond system and then replaced. The best way to remove water is to purge/drain the filter system and/or the bottom drains to waste. Just adding water and letting the pond overflow will not accomplish the desired results unless significantly more water is transferred. Water added to replace what was lost by evaporation is **not** part of a change out!

It is considered appropriate to change out 10 to 20 percent of a pond's water per week. Any water replaced after a weekly back flush of a filter system or other maintenance actions should be included as being part of the weekly change out amount. When making the water replacement with tap water that contains chlorine or chloramines remember to use a dechlorinator such as sodium thiosulphate (ST). Don't forget to turn off the water when the pond is full! Better yet, put an inexpensive flow timer shutoff device that hook directly on the hose. Those devices can be obtained from the gardening department of your local DIY store for \$20 or less.

Should I do water changes in the winter? Yes! When the water temp drops into the 50s or less, the koi immunity basically comes to a halt. They are far more susceptible to the negative impacts of poor water quality. So if there were any time in the year when you want the very best water quality....it is in the cold months of winter and early spring. Maintain high water quality in the winter to reduce the probabilities of koi health problems in the spring. Remember, dilution really is the solution to pollution.



MOVING ON

This weekend I moved seven of my "chosen" koi from their pond to a temporary winter home. Just for this year, they will spend some time vacationing in Ken and Carole's Smithtown, LI, NY, new 26,000-gallon pond. But one fish won't be going with them. "Pickles" is the fish that has chosen to remain behind. She's the first koi I ever bought, in 1992, for a whopping \$30 plus tax from the local rip-off pet shop (that's no longer in business). She was named by a friend's daughter. The kid called her the "pickle fish" so we named her Pickles.

Pickles and I have a fourteen-year relationship that has taught me a lot about caring for koi. In many ways she was my practice fish. I learned about Aeromonas from Pickles. I cried while giving her the intraperitoneal injections. I was sure she was going to die or that I was going to penetrate a vital organ by mistake. She was so tame, so used to being handled at that time that she didn't need any anesthetic for our daily ritual. I had her in a 2' x 3' filter box so I wouldn't have to chase her for the treatment. She didn't complain. Then, when a new fish was added to the pond it was Pickles that introduced them to our feeding regimen, sort of taking the newbie under her wing. She made a great dorm mom. But this time, she isn't going south with me either because next week (or soon thereafter) I will be leaving this house and pond behind. The new owners will be here.

The way Pickles chose to remain in Uniondale was unique and I never expected it from her. My friends, Lou Cerami and Gene Wong, had come bright and early to drain the pond once again and remove the fish I would take to Florida (and over winter in Smithtown until Florida is ready for them). To make this as easy as possible, I removed the fish from the quarantine tank first, giving the two goldfish and one shubunkin to Joy Stockmeyer and the five young koi were put into the big pond (for the new homeowner). Then, as each Florida-bound koi was hoisted from the bottom of the near empty pond it was carried to the quarantine tank in a sock net to await the next leg of its journey. They all did very well. It was finished in less than an hour! I had a net tightly stretched over the top of the quarantine tank. The fish would wait until tomorrow to see their new winter pond.

Sunday morning came and went with about a dozen volunteers carrying furniture and boxes out of the basement. After they left, I started getting ready to move the fish. I let the dogs out while I got myself packed up. Shortly after that I heard the dogs barking and I went to see what was up. They weren't barking at the fence. They were barking at something behind the quarantine tank. It was Pickles, very dry and covered with dirt, barely breathing. But the dogs knew they had found something that didn't belong there, luckily for Pickles.

I quickly dropped her back into the quarantine tank where she just sank to the bottom and laid there on her side, not really breathing. Experience taught me that if she was going to make it she would need the cleanest water available. So, I scooped her back out and into the big pond where all the water was fresh and moving nicely. The other koi all came to her aid. It was amazing to watch as they righted her and swam her around. She kept trying to sink to the bottom but the other fish were right there keeping her up and moving! I swear they talked to her, and before long she was swimming. Yes, Pickles is going to stay in Uniondale. She was trying to find her way home and if it wasn't for the dogs, she might have not have made it. The other seven fish are quite happy in their new temporary home. Going from 6,000 to 26,000gallons in the Gugliucci pond didn't seem to hurt them one bit! Thankfully they had a Microbe-Lift pond waiting for them. They will do fine.

So, I had my very own "fall koi harvest" this year, in Uniondale, Long Island, and I carried some pretty large koi in big bags of water, thanks to Suburban Water Gardens who gave me the bags for this occasion. Yes, and I have the painful muscles to prove it. But once I get to Florida, it will all be worth it...

We are one step closer to the ultimate goal.


