

Elusive Eragon

As many of our members know, our pond just happens to be situated in an area of my yard that is prone to flooding from the local Nancy Creek...but not just any flooding, we're talking 100-500 year high flooding. Our pond is approximately a quarter of a mile from Nancy Creek. That being said, we shouldn't be seeing floods like this, but we've seen a flood 3 times in the last 6 years, the most recent being about 3 months or so ago. Additionally, creeks have some great hiding places, like around tree trunks, etc. And with each attempt, we increased the number of people helping, but that didn't seem to make much difference either. Eragon was a crafty little Yamabuki. Even funnier, there was a school of catfish in the creek, and Eragon was leading the way.

So, we decided to try one last time on a Sunday morning. Some friends and neighbors decided to help us. We totaled 7.
