

- Don't start feeding your fish until the WATER temperature settles in at above 50 degrees.
- Watch all of your fish for signs of parasites. Extreme winter weather has compromised some of their immunity and they may become more vulnerable to infection.
- Be sure to limit feeding until the filter system has time to catch up with bacteria.
- Check for AMMONIA and do water changes as necessary.
- Keep your pond clean. Fish deserve a clean place to live.
- Clear water IS NOT ALWAYS GOOD QUALITY WATER...keep checking the water perameters.



Koi USA, Heads Up!

All Koi USA subscribers please be aware you must request the club member \$20 subscription price for AKCA club members each time you subscribe or renew your subscription to KOI USA.

PCS, the subscription service AKCA hired, groups subscribers into groups based on how they subscribed last. So, if you subscribed at the full rate of \$24.95 then the renewal invoice you receive at the end of that subscription will show that amount, even though you have joined an AKCA member club. OLD BUSINESS:

We are still waiting for Contracts to be completed for equipment rental in 2010 by Mid-Georgia and the AKCA Show in Nashville.

The Budget was reviewed again and discussed changes in Rental, Advertising and Income.

Bill Fricke will set up a time to inventory the Trailer. Mike Roach volunteered to help Bill.

NEW BUSINESS:

Julie Melancon has volunteered to coordinate the raffle at the monthly meeting. Vicki Knill discussed how she handled purchasing prizes in the past and was reimbursed. After today's raffle and the income is determined, a budget will be established for future prize purchases.

Steve Castel has some changes to make to the Auction Procedures. Bill Fricke will discuss the changes with Steve. More help is needed in the bagging and pickup area.

Steve Castel will be asked to notify members of the Auction Rules and signage at the auction. Most importantly attention will be directed to not selling/buying fish outside of the auction process.

The Koi Show will be the 3rd weekend in September. All Wet Vendors have paid registration fees. Still lining up Judges and Benching. Other Vendors are being determined.

GENERAL MEMBERSHIP:

He specified the purpose of Landscaping was to connect the earth to the sky. He began by identifying tall

Calloway Gardens Koi Pond Clean-up



Dave Jones, Harvey Siskin and Doug Tatz went to Calloway Gardens to do a koi rescue in the pond in the front of the conservatory. It's a 70- thousand gallon pond without filtration. Dave asked them drain the pond overnight and when we got there is was knee deep... but with 8-10 inches of muck. It hadn't been cleaned since 2003! I think we pulled out around 80 — 2 foot average— koi and nearly 2000 goldfish out of there.

The koi were put in a fountain in the conservatory. It's not filtered either, so they will have to do water changes and watch them closely, but it was the only place to put them until the big pond was cleaned.

Callaway Gardens thought they had more koi, but most of what they were seeing were the goldfish.

They kept nearly all the koi because 80 koi in that size pond is ok, but we put the goldfish in containers to be frozen for food for the raptors that they have a show for. Dave took about 100 goldfish and Harvey took about 20 of the goldfish. The idea was no more goldfish in the pond going forward. It was a lot of work, especially seining the pond with that much muck in it. Then lifting the

fish up and over the 5 foot wall of the pond. Boy am I sore today!

Callaway is going to scrape all the muck out, pressure wash it, and then refill it and put the koi back in. So it will look great when they are done.
