It's Show Time

Eight years ago our koi show was paired up with JapanFest which at that time it was held at Stone Mountain Park. Increased costs forced us to leave and move to a less expensive venue. For 2 years we held our show independently at the North Atlanta Trade Center but again increasing fees meant we had to move elsewhere. Bill and Lynn Dowden graciously offered the club the use of the Coastal Ponds warehouse to stage our koi show. For the past 5 years we have enjoyed the convenience of the warehouse but drawing enough public exposure has been a struggle. Our vendors are dependent on a good rate of foot traffic. Limiting the number of fish vendors helped them but those with dry goods did not fair as well.

During this time JapanFest had garnered enough corporate support to allow them to relocate to the Gwinnett Convention Center. At their new location Japan Fest grew to draw in 30,000 visitors over the course of the weekend. Both JapanFest and our koi show is always on the same weekend in September. This past winter Carl and I approached the Japan Fest organizers to once again partner our events.

They thought it would be wonderful if the Atlanta Koi Club returned to have the koi show with them. They said they still get attendees looking for the fish show. After several emails and phone conversations Carl and I met with representatives of the Consulate General of Japan and Gwinnett Center. We met in the parking lot of Gwinnett Center to work out the ideal location and discuss the needs of a koi show. JapanFest will provide us with free advertising, we will be linked to their website and our show will be on the Gwinnett Center marquee. This year our show returns to Japan Fest. The AKC Koi & Goldfish Show will maintain it's independence but will be in conjunction with JapanFest. Due to the large amount of space needed for our show it will be staged outside in the Convention Center parking area in front of the entrance to JapanFest. Admission is free to the koi show but those attending JapanFest will be lined up across from our vendor tent to buy their tickets.

Visitors will pass through the large vendor tent to reach the koi show tanks. At the other end of the show tanks will be a smaller tent with the goldfish show, Porta Johns and roped off from the public the benching team and volunteer dining area. The Consulate General of Japan is offering free admission passes to JapanFest for our working volunteers.

Support our show by working and receive a free pass to JapanFest.

This is going to be a wonderful opportunity to see our show grow. We need the support of volunteers to make it happen. One important area where we will need help is set up. Tents will be set up Thursday. We will need to set up the tanks, fill them and have air supplied Thursday to be ready by Friday morning. During the show we will use the Gwinnett Center Security personnel to monitor the show at night. A watchman will stay at the show site. We will be able to take advantage of the special hotel prices listed on the JapanFest website.

Atlanta Koi Club Meeting Minutes – May 15, 2011

Executive Committee Meeting:

Vicki Knill discussed the JapanFest site selection at the Gwinnett Center. The dates for the Fall Show are September 16, 17, and 18. The Gwinnett Center has its own well; so the club will have no water expense.

Next discussed were blue water tanks as suggested in Bill Dowden's recent email suggesting the club may need to buy more. Clay mentioned Gloria Jones would sell us 4 for \$250 each but, since they may or may not be the same size as the ones we already own, Clay asked her to send him pictures. Mr. Lee reminded the others these would be another unbudgeted expense.

The Davids have agreed to arrange the catering for the club banquet following the Fall Show. They may choose a site other than the Elks Club facility closer to the Gwinnett Center.

Clay volunteered Julie Melancon to do the raffle.

Next discussed was the Pond Tour and the reception for hosts at Stone Forest between 5:00 and 6:30 p.m. Clay will again ask their management if we can have it for another hour, even if we have to reimburse them for an additional hour's overtime for one of their employees.

Briefly discussed the cost of up to \$500 for software for the Newsletter editor. Not sure what software is required and if cheaper markets have been explored. Other alternatives need to be explored. Once again this is a non-budgeted item.

Discussed using PayPal for club merchandise. Mr. Lee said it was nearly ready to go, and again mentioned it will be vital to involve Michael Anderson, the club webmaster.

General Membership Meeting:

New members were introduced and welcomed to the meeting.

The Pond Tour will be held on June 25, 2011 from 9:00 AM until 5:00 PM. A reception will be held at Stone Forest in Marietta, Ga from 5:00 PM until 6:30 PM following the Tour.

Doug Tatz has accepted the duties as the Club Newsletter Editor.

The 2011 Auction had fewer bidders but made more money than last year. Good job all who worked setup, auction and cleanup.

The 2011 Koi Show will be held in conjunction with the Japan Fest at Gwinnett Civic Center. The Show will be held in the parking lot so at no cost to the club. Other amenities such as tents and generators will be required and are being explored.

Vicki Knill was voted 2011 Koi Person of the Year. Naturally Carl is included in the honor as a supporting party.

The Kohaku grow out was then begun. All persons who had prepaid drew numbers for the Koi they were to take home. Pictures had been taken earlier and assigned numbers matching the lottery numbers. The quest then was to match numbers, pictures and fish. It got a little exciting at times but all in good fun. The remaing koi were sold to persons not having prepaid but wishing to be in the grow out. Remember, the object is not to grow a Grand Champion but to grow the best fish you can for the 2012 Show competition. Can you keep it alive, can you grow it large, will it keep it's color? Of course if it does become a Grand Champion, good for you.
